KKC teachers run **after-school bible programs** in several of our schools. Students sing and dance to worship songs, listen to stories, discuss passages from the bible, and pray together.

The bible programs are entirely optional, but almost every student at these schools attends each week.

*Students in Grades 4-9 receive a bible to read and keep.*
